# ACTIVITIES FOR HOME



**CRAFT SAFETY:** Adult supervision is required for any arts & crafts project. Observe children closely and intervene as needed to prevent potential safety problems and ensure appropriate use of materials. Some craft items are potential choking hazards for young children. Avoid use of small parts with children ages 3 or younger. Read all manufacturers' warnings before using arts & crafts supplies.



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# PAPERCRAFT ANIMALS

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Non-toxic glue
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Googly eyes



**CAUTION:** The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.





1. Cut out 3 pieces of construction paper.  
(Body: 3 x 8.5 in, Head: 2.5 x 7.5 in, Belly: 2 x 3.5 in)



2. Cut a round edge on one side of the white construction paper.



3. Measure a 1-inch rectangle on one side of the two black construction papers. (See red lines)



4. Apply the glue to the 1-inch rectangular area that is marked in the previous step, and form a tube.



5. Glue the white piece of construction paper to create the penguin belly.



6. Glue the head on top of the body.



7. Cut out a base, two feet and a beak out of construction paper. Select two googly eyes of your choice.



Glue all the pieces to the penguin body.





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# COTTON POLAR BEAR

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Non-toxic stick glue
- Non-toxic liquid glue
- Pencil
- Pipe cleaner
- Cotton balls



**CAUTION:** The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.





1. Print out the provided bear template.



2. Cut out the bear template.



3. Trace the bear template onto a piece of white construction paper.



4. Cut out the traced bear shape from the construction paper.



5. Use liquid glue to cover the construction paper with cotton balls.



6. Cut out the eyes and the nose in the size of your choice. .



7. Glue the nose and eyes on top of the layer of cotton balls.



8. Create a mouth out of pipe cleaner and glue it on top of the cotton balls.





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# COLORFUL TISSUE PAPER FOREST

## WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

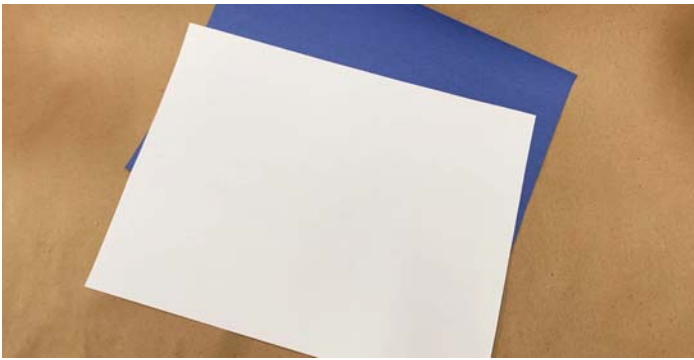
- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Tissue paper
- Glossy Mod Podge®
- Sponge brush
- Non-toxic glue



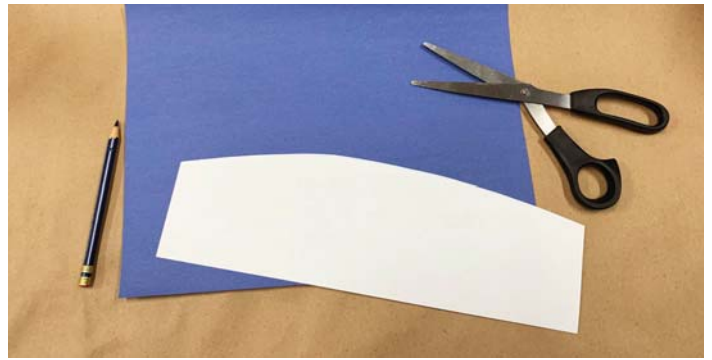
**CAUTION:** The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.



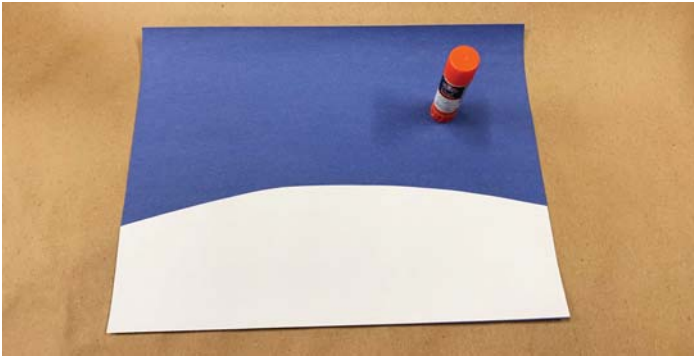




1. Use blue and white construction paper for the background of your landscape.



2. Cut the white construction paper to create a hill.



3. Glue the white construction paper to the blue construction paper.



4. Find different colored tissue paper and cut them into rectangles and squares.



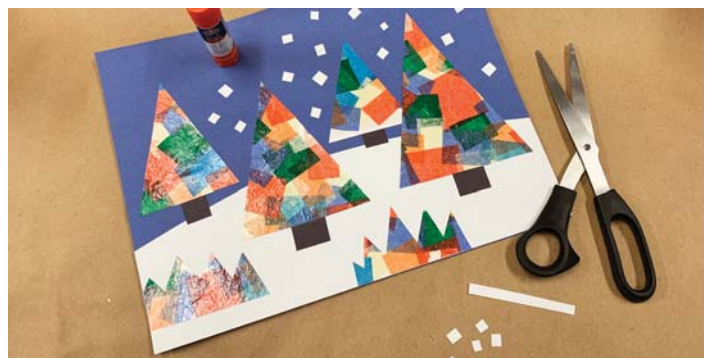
5. Use Mod Podge to glue the tissue paper to a new white piece of construction paper.



6. Cut tree shapes and bushes out of the now colorful paper. Use brown paper to cut out trunks.



7. Glue the tree shapes, bushes, and tree trunks to the background you created with the blue and white construction paper.



8. Finish the landscape off by gluing on snow squares made from the white construction paper.
