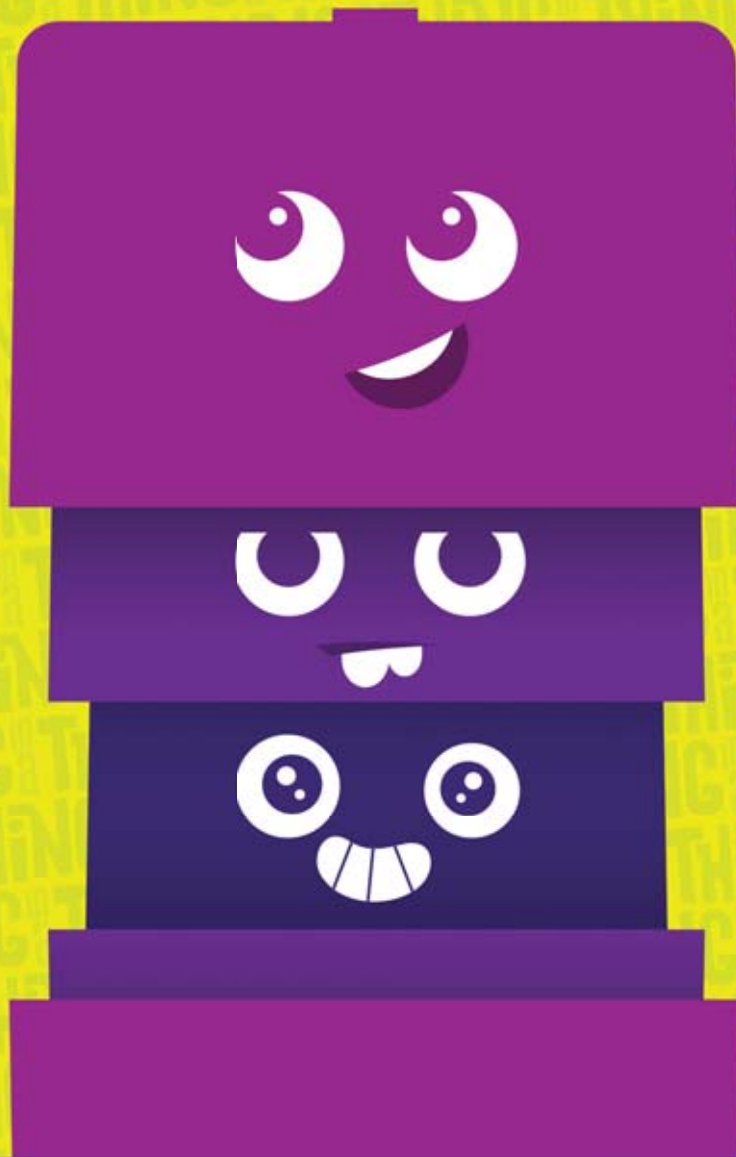

STACKING ANIMALS

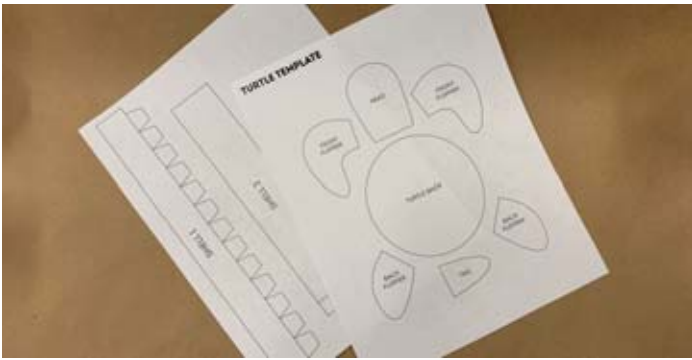
WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Construction paper
- Pencil
- Non-toxic glue
- Googly eyes



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.





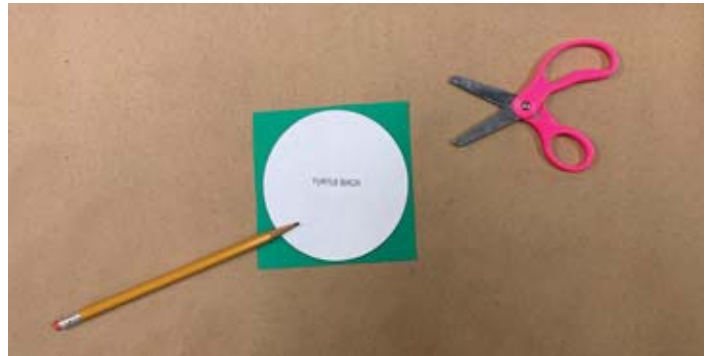
1. Print out the turtle template found on pages 9 & 10.



2. Cut out the pieces on the template.



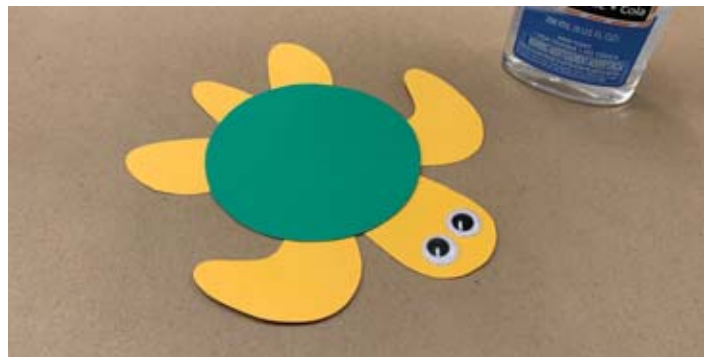
3. Trace the limb pieces on construction paper with a pencil, and then cut them out with the safety scissors.



4. Trace the turtle back on construction paper and cut it out.



5. Glue the limbs to the turtle back as shown in the image above.



6. Glue googly eyes to the face of the construction paper turtle.



7. Trace each of the shell templates on construction paper and cut them out.



8. Fold up the teeth on Shell 1.



9. Glue Shell 1 into a circle.



10. Glue the circle to the turtle's back.



11. Glue Shell 2 and Shell 3 into a circle.



12. Place them into Shell 1 to create a 3D shell effect.

LID CREATURES

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Jar lids
- Non-toxic paint
- Paint brush
- Washi tape
- Clear tape
- Pipe cleaners
- Googly eyes
- Non-toxic glue



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.





1. Use the lids of jars for the body of your lid creature.



2. Paint the lid in any color and let it dry. You may need multiple coats of paint to cover the lid.



3. Decorate the lid with patterned washi tape.



4. Create limbs by attaching pipe cleaners to the bottom of the lid with clear tape.



5. Glue on googly eyes to give your lid creature more personality.

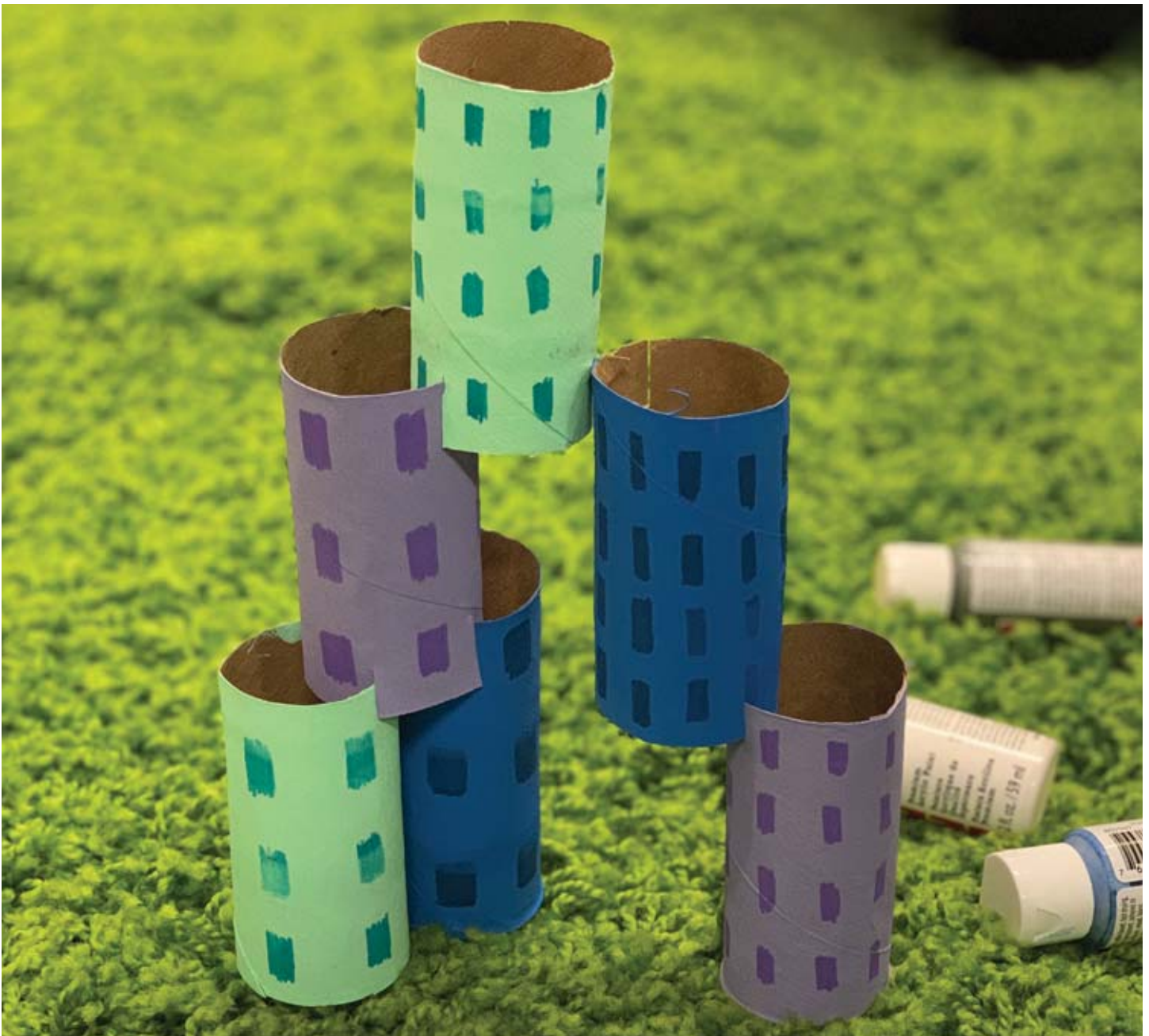
WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

STACKING CITY

- Safety scissors
- Paper towel rolls
- Non-toxic paint
- Paint brush
- Non-toxic markers

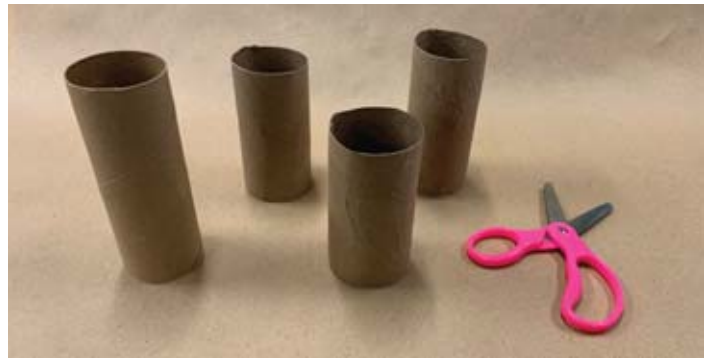


CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.





1. Use any size of paper towel roll that you have available.



2. Use a paper towel roll as is or cut longer paper rolls into a smaller size.



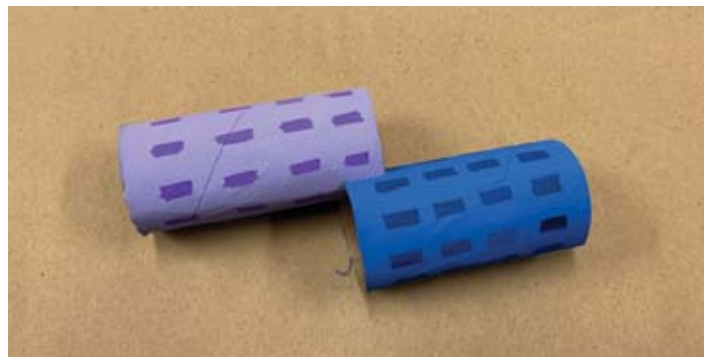
3. Paint the paper towel rolls in any color and let them dry.



4. Use a marker to draw rows of windows on your painted paper towel rolls.



5. Cut half inch slots into your paper towel roll.



6. Using the slots join the paper towel rolls together to create your stackable city.



7. Arrange your stacked city in any way you like.
