CRAFT SAFETY: Adult supervision is required for any arts & crafts project. Observe children closely and intervene as needed to prevent potential safety problems and ensure appropriate use of materials. Some craft items are potential choking hazards for young children. Avoid use of small parts with children ages 3 or younger. Read all manufacturers' warnings before using arts & craft supplies.




TAPE ANIMALS

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Construction paper
- 3-4 washi tape rolls
- Googly eyes
- · Non-toxic glue
- Colored pencils



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.






1. Choose any color of construction paper.



3. Trace the shape onto construction paper.



5. Trace the template shape over the washi tape one more time for clarity.



7. Decorate the animal shape with eyes and anything you like.



2. Sketch the animal shape on plain white paper, and cut out the shapes.



4. Layer 2 to 4 washi tape designs on top of the shape that you have traced on the construction paper.



6. Cut out the shape with the washi tape on top of it.



DIY STICKERS

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Safety scissors
- Adhesive paper
 - Non-toxic markers
- Colored pencils
- Item to decorate



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.






1. Use adhesive paper or any kind of labels.



3. Color in the drawings on the adhesive paper.



5. Peel off the backing of the adhesive paper.



2. Sketch drawings onto the adhesive paper.



4. Cut out the drawings.



6. Personalize your notebook or other item by putting your DIY stickers onto it.



TAPE RESIST GREETING CARDS

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Construction paper
- Masking tape
- Slim washi tape
- Safety scissors Non-toxic paints
 - Colored pencil
 - Marker



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting or handling.






1. Choose any type of construction paper and cut it into any shape you want your greeting card to be.



3. Sketch the message you want to put on your greeting card.



5. Paint the spaces between the tape. Before the paint completely dries, peel off the tape.



2. Tape down the piece of construction paper onto a stable surface.



4. Use slim washi tape to create a pattern around the words without covering them up.



6. Let the paint dry completely and outline the sketched message on the card with a marker.
