ACTIVITIES FOR HOME

WATERCOLOR BLOW ART

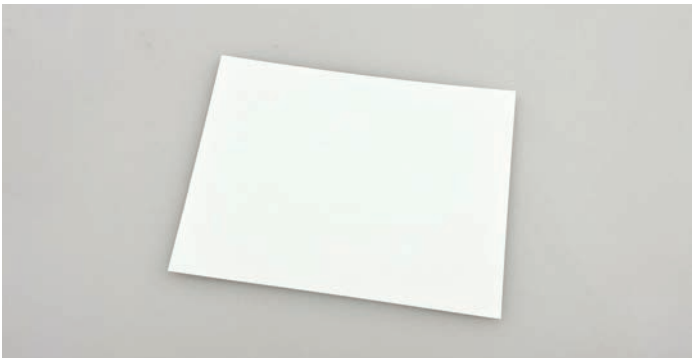
WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Non-toxic Watercolors
- Watercolor paper
- Straw
- Safety scissors
- Non-toxic markers
- Googly eyes
- Brush
- Non-toxic glue



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting with, or handling scissors. Adult assistance with scissors is recommended for children 3 years or younger.





1. Start with a piece of watercolor paper.



2. Use watercolors and paint a spot in the middle of your paper sheet. Use water generously.



3. Use a straw to blow at the watercolor to disperse it.



4. Fill in areas that look too faded with more watercolors.



5. Wait for the painting to be completely dry then glue on the googly eyes.



6. Use markers to add details such as arms and legs.



7. Cut out your alien character.



TISSUE PAPER BOX ALIEN

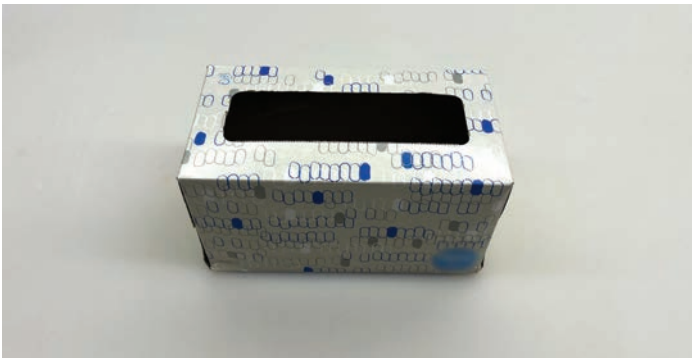
WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Empty tissue box
- Non-toxic paint
- Brush
- Construction paper
- Safety scissors
- Non-toxic glue
- Pencil



CAUTION: The cutting edges of scissors are sharp, and care should be taken whenever cutting with, or handling scissors. Adult assistance with scissors is recommended for children 3 years or younger.





1. Start with an empty tissue box.



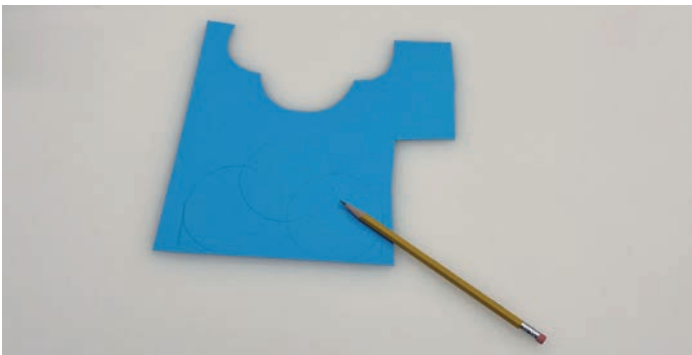
2. Color the tissue box with paint. Apply multiple coats to achieve an opaque finish.



3. Cut out the teeth from the construction paper.



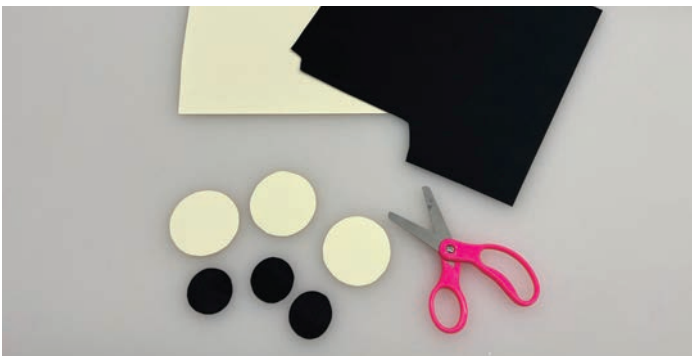
4. Glue the teeth to the opening of the tissue box.



5. Sketch out a cloud-like shape for the eyes.



6. Paint the shape in the same color as the tissue box.



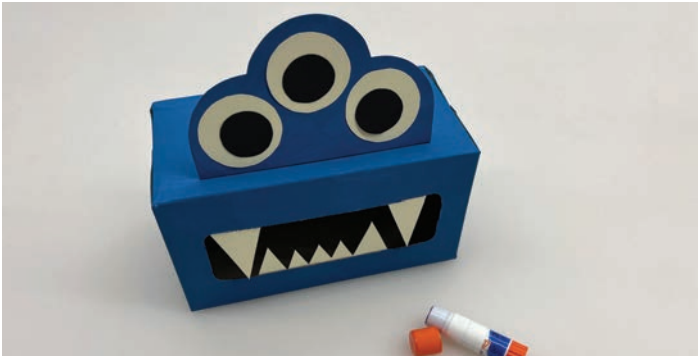
7. Cut out 3 white circles and 3 black circles for the eyes of your alien.



8. Glue the eyes to the cloud-like shape.



9. Fold up the straight edge of the shape to use as a gluing edge.



10. Glue it to the tissue box to act as eyes.



PLANET PAINTING

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Construction paper
- Safety scissors
- Non-toxic glue
- Non-toxic Watercolors
- White non-toxic paint
- Watercolor paper
- Brush
- Kraft or newspaper

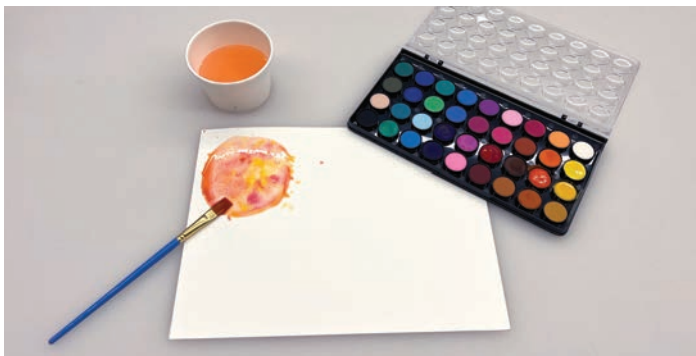




1. Start with watercolor paper, brushes, watercolors and some water.



2. Choose a base color for your planet, and paint a circle.



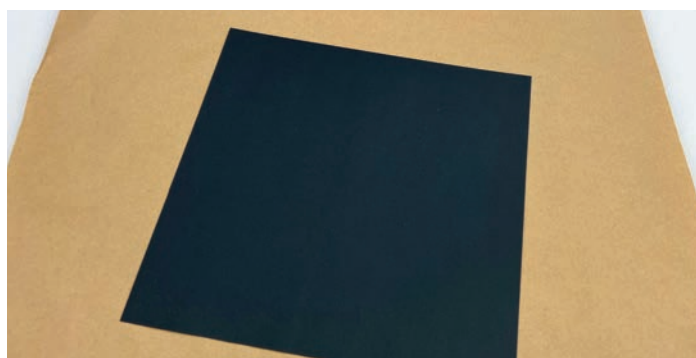
3. Mix in different colors to create a pattern.



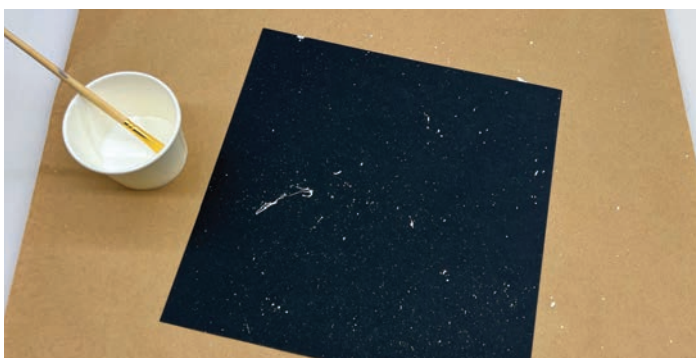
4. Try different colors and different patterns to create a variety of planets.



5. Let the watercolor painting dry.



6. While the watercolors are drying, get a black piece of construction paper. Use kraft paper or newspaper as a splatter guard.



7. Use a brush and white opaque paint to splatter on little dots to create stars. Let the paint dry.



8. When the watercolor-painted planets have dried, cut them into circular shapes.



9. Glue the planets onto the black piece of construction paper.
